September 13th, 1870

My old friend Sister Mary, who is staying at Whinburgh, had done some good works here. In conjunction with my wife & Mr. Carthew, she has sent three huge bales of bandages, shirts, pillows, etc. for the sick & wounded in the war, and has sent to me for special Confession and Absolution an erring Sister in whom she has taken great interest in London & for whom she has found a situation in Dereham.
